"We enjoy seeing the kids wave and their faces light up when their tutors walk in for the day," Tom and Janelle say.

"The kids at Lincoln really enjoy seeing their tutors and telling them about their day. We also enjoy watching their progression in homework."

Janelle also enjoys watching the kids beat Tom at various games, particularly Uno.

"In addition, we give the kids someone they can talk to if they are having a difficult day. In December, we went to the 'Holiday Shop' in the gym and helped the kids pick out presents for family members. During the shopping time, one of the kids was having a hard time due to the passing of a parent. In situations like that, it's important just to be present and listen to the kids, giving them a person they can talk to as opposed to being just someone that answers homework questions," Tom says.

"There are days that are difficult for all of us, but these kids really have overcome so much with the pandemic, changes in protocols, and often needing to help younger siblings with homework at times. We are so proud of all of them!"

Tom and Janelle, we are so thankful for you both, for the heart and soul you both pour into your volunteer work here at GECRC, making such a profound difference in the lives of so many of our students.

## An Alumna Returns to GECRC: Sandy Win Hilaire

Sandy Win Hilaire moved to America from Thailand from a refugee camp in 2008 when she was just 8 years old. She and her family lived in the Parkside Apartments in Glen Ellyn for several years, and she and her younger siblings attended Lincoln Elementary School where she joined the GECRC Lincoln program.

"They helped me with homework after school... and let my parents know what was going on at the school," she says. Sandy learned to speak English through ESL classes at Lincoln, moving into traditional classes in 4th grade after she graduated from ESL.

Sandy says GECRC was tremendously helpful in communicating with her parents about her progress at school.

"The most impactful thing about GECRC was how open they were to help us, and how willing to help, especially because I don't like asking for help."

Sandy still keeps in touch with "Miss Lauren," one of her volunteer tutors from her time at GECRC. Sandy says she would encourage students in the program today to do the same.


"Keep a relationship and still talk to (your tutors)," she says. "You might need their help one day when you're older. Stay in touch with everyone!"

Sandy also says to "read a lot when your volunteer wants to sit down with you... that will help you to learn English a lot faster. Reading goes directly in your head. And ask for help when you need help!"

Sandy graduated from Wheaton North High School in 2020 (her family moved to Wheaton after her 7th grade year). She is currently studying business management at the College of DuPage and is getting married this month. She took her own advice to keep in touch to heart and

recently reached out to GECRC to see if she could help with social media initiatives, as she is taking social media development and graphic design classes. Sandy has also helped GECRC with Burmese translation at an information gathering community forum for GECRC stakeholders. We are thrilled to have her return to GECRC as part of our team! 
