The Glen Ellyn Children's Resource Center is off to a fresh and fantastic start to the 2021/22 academic year! Students across four program sites have begun to meet with their volunteer tutors in person.

"The return to in person after-school programs has been all about celebrating being back together and reconnecting students with their volunteer tutors," says Jackie Reeves, GECRC Director of Program and Volunteers. "While many of our GECRC students were working with volunteer tutors online last year, the need students have for connections to supportive relationships and mentorship is stronger than ever. We have been looking forward to another year filled with learning, friendships, and enriching opportunities."

GECRC was thrilled to finally celebrate the expansion of the in person after-school tutoring program in Community Consolidated School District 89 with a ribbon cutting ceremony at Glen Crest Middle School Sept. 20. The program started virtually last fall due to the Covid-19 pandemic, but now takes place on site, aiming to serve 40 6-8th grade Glen Crest students Monday through Thursday from 2:45 - 3:45 pm.

"GECRC at Glen Crest started out this year in person, which has been such a gift," says Lizzy Doty, Program Coordinator at Glen Crest. "We've already seen our students establishing friendships with each other and our tutors. My hope is that GECRC will continue to grow into a space at Glen Crest where our students feel safe to be themselves and feel known by the community that gathers there."

With the opening of the newest after-school site at Glen Crest, GECRC is able to double the number of students between the ages of 11 to 14 served.

"Over the past two years and during a challenging time for so many, our local community continued raising awareness and funding to ensure GECRC was able to fulfill its long term goal of opening an on site after school program for students of CCSD89," says Leah Harding, Executive Director of the GECRC. "As we celebrate our 20th anniversary this year, it is particularly rewarding to know that we are continuing to adapt and grow in order to fit the needs of the students in our community."

In 2019, GECRC launched a CCSD89 Expansion committee, composed of GECRC board members, CCSD89 administrators, and local community members with the goal to raise \$60,000 to fund two years of programming at Glen Crest Middle School. In 2021, they met and exceeded the expansion fundraising goal.

"The expansion into CCSD89 is a huge accomplishment for the Glen Ellyn Children's
